Sustainable Development Goals

- Adopted by 193 United Nations member states at the UN General Assembly on September 25.
- To be fulfilled by 2030,
- With the «Leave no one behind» motto,
- 17 goals and 169 targets
- Giant media and PR campaign, celebrities
- Will take up a significant part of the agenda and the financing by 2030









History - Millennium Development Goals

- In 2000, 189 countries made a pledge to lift individuals from extreme poverty and many other forms of deprivation. Based on this pledge, experts came up with eight Millennium Development Goals at the UN.
- 2015 was set as the deadline to meet these goals.






























Year 2012...



SDG 4 - Quality Education

- 4.1. By 2030, ensure that all girls and boys complete free, equitable and quality primary and secondary education leading to relevant and effective learning outcomes
- 4.2. By 2030, ensure that all girls and boys have access to quality early childhood development, care and pre-primary education so that they are ready for primary education
- 4.3. By 2030, ensure equal access for all women and men to affordable and quality technical, vocational and tertiary education, including university
- 4.4. 2By 2030, substantially increase the number of youth and adults who have relevant skills, including technical and vocational skills, for employment, decent jobs and entrepreneurship
- 4.5. By 2030, eliminate gender disparities in education and ensure equal access to all levels of education and vocational training for the vulnerable, including persons with disabilities, indigenous peoples and children in vulnerable situations







SDG 4 - Quality Education

- 4.6. By 2030, ensure that all youth and a substantial proportion of adults, both men and women, achieve literacy and numeracy
- 4.7. By 2030, ensure that all learners acquire the knowledge and skills needed to promote sustainable development, including, among others, through education for sustainable development and sustainable lifestyles, human rights, gender equality, promotion of a culture of peace and non-violence, global citizenship and appreciation of cultural diversity and of culture's contribution to sustainable development
- 4.a. Build and upgrade education facilities that are child, disability and gender sensitive and provide safe, non-violent, inclusive and effective learning environments for all
- 4.b. By 2020, substantially expand globally the number of scholarships available to developing countries, in particular least developed countries, small island developing States and African countries, for enrolment in higher education, including vocational training and information and communications technology, technical, engineering and scientific programmes, in developed countries and other developing countries
- 4.c. By 2030, substantially increase the supply of qualified teachers, including through international cooperation for teacher training in developing countries, especially least developed countries and small island developing States









sivilcivic SDG 8 - Decent Work and Economic Growth

- 8.1. Sustain per capita economic growth in accordance with national circumstances and, in particular, at least 7 per cent gross domestic product growth per annum in the least developed countries
- 8.2. Achieve higher levels of economic productivity through diversification, technological upgrading and innovation, including through a focus on highvalue added and labour-intensive sectors
- 8.3. Promote development-oriented policies that support productive activities, decent job creation, entrepreneurship, creativity and innovation, and encourage the formalization and growth of micro-, small- and medium-sized enterprises, including through access to financial services
- 8.4. Improve progressively, through 2030, global resource efficiency in consumption and production and endeavour to decouple economic growth from environmental degradation, in accordance with the 10-Year Framework of Programmes on Sustainable Consumption and Production, with developed countries taking the lead
- 8.5. By 2030, achieve full and productive employment and decent work for all women and men, including for young people and persons with disabilities, and equal pay for work of equal value









sivilcivic SDG 8 - Decent Work and Economic Growth

- 8.6. By 2020, substantially reduce the proportion of youth not in employment, education or training
- 8.7. Take immediate and effective measures to eradicate forced labour, end modern slavery and human trafficking and secure the prohibition and elimination of the worst forms of child labour, including recruitment and use of child soldiers, and by 2025 end child labour in all its forms
- 8.8. Protect labour rights and promote safe and secure working environments for all workers, including migrant workers, in particular women migrants, and those in precarious employment
- 8.9. By 2030, devise and implement policies to promote sustainable tourism that creates jobs and promotes local culture and products
- 8.10. Strengthen the capacity of domestic financial institutions to encourage and expand access to banking, insurance and financial services for all
- 8.a. Increase Aid for Trade support for developing countries, in particular least developed countries, including through the Enhanced Integrated Framework for Trade- related Technical Assistance to Least Developed Countries
- 8.b. By 2020, develop and operationalize a global strategy for youth employment and implement the Global Jobs Pact of the International Labour Organization









SDG 13 - Climate Action

- 13.1. Strengthen resilience and adaptive capacity to climate-related hazards and natural disasters in all countries
- 13.2. Integrate climate change measures into national policies, strategies and planning
- 13.3. Improve education, awareness- raising and human and institutional capacity on climate change mitigation, adaptation, impact reduction and early warning
- 13.a Implement the commitment undertaken by developed-country parties to the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change to a goal of mobilizing jointly \$100 billion annually by 2020 from all sources to address the needs of developing countries in the context of meaningful mitigation actions and transparency on implementation and fully operationalize the Green Climate Fund through its capitalization as soon as possible
- 13.b Promote mechanisms for raising capacity for effective climate change-related planning and management in least developed countries and small island developing States, including focusing on women, youth and local and marginalized communities







High-Level Political Forum (HLPF)

- Agreed upon at Rio+20 to review sustainable development
- Mandated to review SDGs every year in July since 2016
- Meets annually under the auspices of ECOSOC and once every 4 years under the auspices of the UN General Assembly
- To review SDGs, guide paralel work across all UN bodies on the matter, serve as a platform to highlight progress and deficiencies on SDGs, unite all SDG stakeholders

High-Level Political Forum (HLPF)

Voluntary National Reviews (VNR)

- Countries volunteer to conduct reviews on SDG progress
- Approximately 40 to 50 countries every year
- Countries start with a national review preparation process that is recommended to be participative
- Live presentations under normal circumstances but also recorded presentations due to the COVID-19 pandemic in 2020
- Followed by Q&A priority given to other member states, and then major groups and other stakeholders
- Reviews are published on the <u>Sustainable Development Knowledge Platform</u>. This
 year the answers to some questions were also published.







Indicators

- To track global, regional, national or local progress (or regression)
- To guide national monitoring mechanisms
- In communication with the Inter-Agency Expert Group (IAEG) mandated by the UN Statistical Commission
- Agreed upon at the UN Statistical Commission held in March 2017 and adopted at the General Assembly in September. However, the indicators for all targets were completed in March 2020. Annual reviews will continue.
- A total of 247 global indicators were determined to monitor the 17 goals and 169 targets. Data
 is collected under 231 indicators since twelve are repeated under different targets.
- Each country is expected to adapt these indicators in line with their priorities and consider new ones if necessary.







sivilcivic SDG 16 - Peace, Justice and **Strong Institutions**

- **16.1.** Significantly reduce all forms of violence and related death rates everywhere
- **16.1.1.** Number of victims of intentional homicide per 100,000 population, by sex and age
- **16.1.2.** Conflict-related deaths per 100,000 population, by sex, age and cause
- **16.1.3.** Proportion of population subjected to (a) physical violence, (b) psychological violence and (c) sexual violence in the previous 12 months
- **16.1.4.** Proportion of population that feel safe walking alone around the area they live
- **16.2.** End abuse, exploitation, trafficking and all forms of violence against and torture of children
- 16.2.1. Proportion of children aged 1-17 years who experienced any physical punishment and/or psychological aggression by caregivers in the past month
- 16.2.2. Number of victims of human trafficking per 100,000 population, by sex, age and form of exploitation
- **16.2.3.** Proportion of young women and men aged 18–29 years who experienced sexual violence by age 18









sivilcivic SDG 16 - Peace, Justice and **Strong Institutions**

- 16.3. Promote the rule of law at the national and international levels and ensure equal access to justice for all
- 16.3.1. Proportion of victims of violence in the previous 12 months who reported their victimization to competent authorities or other officially recognized conflict resolution mechanisms
- **16.3.2.** Unsentenced detainees as a proportion of overall prison population
- 16.4. By 2030, significantly reduce illicit financial and arms flows, strengthen the recovery and return of stolen assets and combat all forms of organized crime
- **16.4.1.** Total value of inward and outward illicit financial flows (in current United States dollars)
- **16.4.2.** Proportion of seized, found or surrendered arms whose illicit origin or context has been traced or established by a competent authority in line with international instruments
- **16.5.** Substantially reduce corruption and bribery in all their forms
- **16.5.1.** Proportion of persons who had at least one contact with a public official and who paid a bribe to a public official, or were asked for a bribe by those public officials, during the previous 12 months
- **16.5.2.** Proportion of businesses that had at least one contact with a public official and that paid a bribe to a public official, or were asked for a bribe by those public officials during the previous 12 months

Financing for Development - FfD

- It is estimated that achieving the SDGs and lifting more than 700 million people out of poverty will cost 1.4 trillion USD PER YEAR. This amount needs to be transferred to low and lower-middle-income countries.
- What sort of cooperation and financing between the North and the South in order to reach these goals?







Financing for Development - FfD

- Financing for Sustainable Development (FfD) Conferences aim to take the necessary steps to create this resource. Even though significant progress is yet to be achieved in areas highlighted by civil society such as changes to tax systems and more equitable distribution of resources, this is seen as an important advocacy field with regard to sustainable development and SDGs.
- Systemic problems in financing became even more glaring after the onset of the COVID-19 pandemic.
- Some current discussions within FfD: Establishing an international tax agency,
 state support/subsidies to harmful industries, neoliberal states, austerity policies







Youth participation in Agenda 2030

- By definition, sustainable development requires respect for future generations and taking their needs into account.
- As a result, youth has to be key stakeholders in the process.
- There are also direct references to the specific situation of youth in some targets.









- International review mechanism : High-Level Political Forum
- Advocacy mechanism: Major Groups and Other Stakeholders
 - 9 groups were created at the 1992 Environment and Development (Rio) Conference:
 - Women
 - Children and Youth
 - Indigenous Peoples
 - Non-governmental Organizations
 - Local Authorities
 - Workers and Trade Unions
 - Business and Industry
 - Scientific and Technological Community
 - Farmers
 - These groups were adopted as channels through which citizens could participate in the sustainable development processes as **official stakeholders** at the UN level.









- Advocacy mechanism: Major Groups and Other Stakeholders
 - o **2012: Rio+20 conference :** The "meaningful inclusion and active participation" of all parties are required for sustainable development.

9 major groups and other stakeholders:

- Volunteers
- Education and Academia
- Ageing
- Persons with disabilities

More recent additions: LGBTI Stakeholder Group, Together 2030, Civil Society Group on FfD, Sendai Engagement Mechanism, Asia Pacific Regional CSO Engagement Mechanism









- Major Group on Children and Youth (MGCY) a mechanism run completely by children and youth
- O Actively works in many fields (gender, environment, financing etc.).
- Includes representatives from all over the world, requires a legal identity.
- Also carries out direct advocacy by participating in international meetings at the UN.









- Official UN initiatives such as the <u>Sustainable Development Solutions Network</u> also monitor activities in countries/regions and keeps a record of information provided by each country.
- Civil society collectives carry out similar work. Spotlight Reports are published annually in collaboration with organizations such as the Global Policy Forum, Friedrich Ebert Stiftung, Public Services International and DAWN for review purposes. 2020 Spotlight Report "Shifting policies for systemic change"
- Secretary General's <u>Special Envoy on Youth</u>







International Advocacy Opportunities - Ideas for Cyprus

- Only ECOSOC-accredited NGOs can take part in international SDG meetings, BUT...

- Opportunity to make changes within Major Groups and Other Stakeholders
 - Major Group on Children and Youth a mechanism run entirely by youth and children









Young Leaders for SDGs:

• Every two years, 17 young people working towards the implementation of SDGs are selected as Youth Leaders for SDGs.









Young Leaders for SDGs:

- 2018 2019: Burak Doluay
 - o Founded <u>CyprusInno.com</u> in 2016. The platform aims to contribute to peace through intercommunal entrepreneurship networks in conflict zones via digital and personal efforts.
- 2020 2021: İlayda Eskitaşçıoğlu from Turkey with the "<u>We Need To Talk</u>" project, which deals with period stigma and period poverty.



Advocacy Opportunities for Cyprus

- Voluntary implementation and reporting
 - What can civil society participation achieve? Contributions such as working on social exclusion, supporting the delivery of better services and making sure people in need can benefit, making sure resources are used for the needs of the society, achieving a government system that is more sensitive towards the needs of its citizens and increasing citizen participation in policy areas and supporting their voices
- Each country must appoint a Focal Point for SDGs
 - Republic of Cyprus Focal Point



- The Republic of Cyprus has taken action to submit a Voluntary National Review again in 2021.











- Country civil society mechanisms mechanisms bringing civil society together with or without government support not just for monitoring purposes but also to plan, monitor and implement SDGs
- Alternative / Shadow reporting
 - Stock taking
 - Highlighting deficiencies
 - Compiling recommendations backed by data
 - Treating as a roadmap to developing an advocacy strategy
- Civic Space: Can support bi-communal shadow/alternative reports for SDGs or other international agreements.

Private Sector

- Summary of this year's HLPF: PPPs for BBB (Public-private partnerships for Building Back Better)
- Impossible not to think of the private sector as an important player!
- May become an important advocacy tool through both their own internal sustainability and their social responsibility projects!
